Irwin Mandel
Senior Vice President-Financial & Legal

Entering his 31st season, Irwin Mandel has the longest tenure of anyone with the Bulls ... the senior financial executive in the NBA, and one of the most experienced in any management position in the League ... responsible for the Club's financial, legal, and corporate areas ... most important duties include player contracts, financial reports, and applying and interpreting the NBA's salary cap, free agency, and other collective bargaining rules ... one of the select few NBA executives chosen to serve on the committee to advise the League office regarding salary cap rule changes ... said Commissioner David Stern recently, "nobody in the NBA understands the intricacies of the salary cap better than Irwin Mandel" ... also considered one of the NBA's most knowledgeable and creative experts on player contracts and the collective bargaining rules ... helped develop NBA team financial statements and assisted the NBA Labor Relations Committee ... oversaw the instituting of a detailed budget plan for the office and negotiated the Club's switch to charter travel ... recently served as a consultant to two of the other major sports leagues regarding the benefits and workings of the NBA's salary cap and free agency systems ... received both his undergraduate degree in accounting and his law degree from Northwestern University ... he is a Certified Public Accountant and member of the Illinois Bar ... worked in the tax department of Arthur Andersen & Co. for four years prior to joining the Bulls ... formerly served two terms as President of the Northwestern University Club of Chicago and was a recipient of the Northwestern Alumni Service Award ... active in various charitable programs ... speaks regularly to business groups, law schools, and college students regarding legal and financial management careers in professional sports ... avid tennis player ... native Chicagoan ... married to Sheri, with two sons, Michael and Robby, and daughter-in-law Jamie.

On Jan. 14, 1994, Bob became the second Chicago Bull to have his jersey (#10) retired ... he is a three-time NBA All-Star and is ranked second on the Bulls' all-time scoring list with 12,623 points.



Joe O'Neil Senior Director of Ticket Operations

In his 24th season, Joe O'Neil is responsible for the accounting, printing, processing and delivery of all season, group and individual ticket orders ... Joe is also the Bulls' liaison with TicketMaster, United Center Management and oversees the Bulls' fleet automobile program ... SHERI L. BERTO CENTER

The Chicago Bulls broke ground for the Sheri L. Berto Center on October 21, 1991 and less than a year later the finest facility of its kind was up and running. The building itself is as unique and impressive as the individual whose name it bears.

Sheri L. Berto, who had been Bulls Chairman Jerry Reinsdorf's long-time assistant, was a favorite among everyone in the organization. On November 23, 1991, the entire Bulls organization experienced a great loss when Sheri passed away suddenly from undiagnosed internal bleeding while a patient at Lutheran General Hospital in Park Ridge.

In her position as Mr. Reinsdorf's assistant, Sheri had the opportunity to touch and brighten the lives of countless people from fans to heads of state. Her wonderful sense of humor and ability to bring joy to any situation were immediately missed even more than her considerable professional skills.

During the remainder of the 1991-92 season, the team wore black patches on their jerseys in memory of Sheri. When the new training facility opened in September of 1992, it was named The Sheri L. Berto Center and dedicated to her memory. The building continues to serve as a tribute to the countless contributions Sheri made to the Bulls, their fans and the community, as she is still greatly missed by all who had the pleasure of meeting her.



Bill Berry Assistant Coach

In his fourth season as an assistant coach with the Bulls ... Bill Berry was hired as part of Tim Floyd's staff on August 10, 1999 ... prior to joining the Bulls, spent eight years with the Houston Rockets (1991-99) ... Houston hired him as a scout in 1991 and he joined Head Coach Rudy Tomjanovich's staff as an assistant coach in February, 1992 ... was an assistant coach and scout for the Sacramento Kings from 1989-91 ... served as head coach at San Jose State from 1979-89 ... while at San Jose State, compiled the second-highest win total in school history with a 142-144 record in 10 seasons ... under his direction, the Spartans earned berths in both the NCAA and NIT tournaments ... was the top assistant at his alma mater, Michigan State, from 1977-79 under then-head coach Jud Heathcote ... during that span, coached future NBA players Magic Johnson, Greg Kelsner and Jay Vincent ... he helped Michigan State to two Big Ten championships and the NCAA title in 1979 ... also spent time as an assistant at Cal-Berkeley (1972-77), as head coach at Cosumnes River Junior College (1970-72) and as head coach at Highlands High School in Sacramento (1966-69) ... played at Michigan State under head coach Fordy Anderson (1961-64) and went on to earn his master's degree in physical education in 1969 while coaching.



Pete Myers Assistant Coach

In his fourth season with the Bulls organization and first full season as an assistant coach ... joined Bill Cartwright's coaching staff on December 28, 2001 ... prior to joining the coaching staff, Myers spent two seasons as a scout ... selected by the Bulls in the sixth round (120th overall) of the 1986 NBA Draft ... during his eight-year NBA career, played for five teams, including two seasons with the Bulls (1986-87, 1993-94) ... averaged a career-high 7.9 ppg and 3.0 apg while shooting a career-high .455 from the field as a starter for the Bulls in 1993-94 ... also played in the CBA and the Italian League ... Pete and his wife, Donna live in Lombard, Ill with their three children.



Bob Thornton Assistant Coach

In his first season as an assistant with the Bulls ... hired as part of Bill Cartwright's staff on July 8, 2002 ... prior to joining the Bulls, Thornton served as head coach of the NBDL Huntsville Flight ... before joining the Flight, spent 2000-2001 as head coach of the CBA Quad City Thunder, where he was also responsible for all basketball personnel decisions and player recruitment ... In 1999-2000, Thornton was an assistant coach for the CBA Champion Yakima Sun Kings ... spent two seasons as an assistant coach at the collegiate level, with Chapman University (1997-98) and Cal State Fullerton (1998-99) ... selected by the New York Knicks in the fourth round (87th overall) of the 1984 NBA Draft ... an eight-year veteran of the NBA, Thornton played for five NBA teams (New York Knicks, Philadelphia 76ers, Minnesota Timberwolves, Utah Jazz, and Washington Bullets) ... played two-and-half seasons (1985-87) in New York with Head Coach Bill Cartwright ... played three seasons in the Italian A-1 League with Rome, Siena, and Pavia ... played college basketball at California-Irvine, where he also received a bachelor's degree in Social Science ... Thornton, 39, and his wife Kim were married over the summer.



Mike Wilhelm Assistant Coach/Advance Scout

Enters his first season with the Bulls ... hired as part of Bill Cartwright's staff on September 5, 2002 ... spent last season performing scouting duties for the Denver Nuggets ... spent four years as the Advance Scout/Head Video Coordinator for the Cleveland Cavaliers, supervising the video department and scouting upcoming opponents ... also served as assistant coach for the WNBA Cleveland Rockers ... an assistant coach for Haverford College in 1995-96 ... Wilhelm, 35, played college basketball at Southampton (NY) College.



B.J. Armstrong Special Assistant to Executive Vice President-Basketball Operations

In his third season with the Bulls' front office ... B.J. Armstrong was hired as the Special Assistant to the Executive Vice President-Basketball Operations on July 5, 2000 ... his duties include a wide variety of scouting assignments, on-the-floor work during training camp and all aspects of player development ... after an 11-year career as a player in the NBA, including seven full seasons with the Bulls, Armstrong announced his retirement at the Bulls' last home game of the 1999-2000 season on April 18, 2000 ... served as a courtside analyst for TNT during the 2000 NBA Playoffs ... has been a special correspondent/guest host for TNT, NBA Inside Stuff and ESPN Radio ... played his first six seasons with the Bulls after he was selected by the club in the first round (18th overall) of the 1989 NBA Draft ... was a member of the Chicago Bulls' first three World Champion teams (1991, 1992, 1993) ... led the NBA in three-point field goal percentage in 1993 (.453) ... named a 1994 Eastern Conference All-Star with the Bulls ... selected by the Toronto Raptors in the 1995 NBA Expansion Draft and was later traded to Golden State ... was traded again to Charlotte early in the 1997-98 season before re-signing with the Bulls as a free agent on August 30, 1999 ... B.J., 34, and his wife, Jennifer, live in Highland Park, Ill. and have a two-year-old son, Oscar.



Ivica Dukan Supervisor of International Scouting

In his 12th season with the Bulls ... Ivica Dukan began his role as the Bulls' first Supervisor of International Scouting on August 20, 1992 ... he divides his scouting time between Europe, the NBA and U.S. colleges ... worked as a scout for the Bulls during the 1991-92 season on a part-time basis ... Dukan, 43, had an outstanding 14-year professional career overseas, as he played in England, Switzerland, France and Yugoslavia ... was known throughout Europe as a defensive specialist and strong three-point shooter ... a Croatia native, he served as captain of the team in Split ... played for the Yugoslavia National Team ... Ivica and his wife, Gordana, reside in Deerfield with their son, Duj.



Gar Forman Special Assistant to Executive Vice President-Basketball Operations

In his fifth season with the Bulls ... promoted to Special Assistant to Executive Vice-President of Basketball Operations on June 20, 2002 ... previously held the position of scout (1998-2002) ... was an assistant coach/recruiting coordinator at Iowa State from 1994-98, helping lead the Cyclones to the 1996 Big Eight Championship, three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and three Top 25 finishes ... prior to Iowa State, was assistant coach/recruiting coordinator from 1988-94 at New Mexico State, where the team went to five straight NCAA Tournaments, including the Sweet Sixteen in 1992, and earned five consecutive Top 25 finishes ... during that time, NMSU won four Big West Conference Championships, posted a 123-35 overall record and finished as high as 11th in the nation (1991) ... was assistant coach/recruiting coordinator at Cal Poly Pomona in 1987-88 ... was a part-time assistant coach at New Mexico State University from 1985-87 ... first head coaching position was at the College of the Desert (Palm Desert, Calif.) from 1983-85, leading the team to consecutive 20-win seasons and to a school-record 13 conference wins in 1984-85 ... was assistant coach at the College of the Desert in 1982-83 ... first coaching position was at his alma mater, Utah State University, as a graduate assistant/JV coach in 1981-82 ... received his bachelor of arts in marketing and education in 1982 from Utah State ... Gar and his wife, Leslie, reside in Lincolnshire, Ill with their son Braeden.



Fred Tedeschi Head Athletic Trainer

In his fifth season as the Bulls' head trainer ... Fred Tedeschi was hired on August 6, 1998 ... prior to joining the Bulls, he was the head athletic trainer at the University of California-Berkeley for four years ... before working with the Golden Bears, he was the head trainer at Vanderbilt for three years ... began his career as a training assistant with the San Francisco 49ers from 1983-84 ... he was the head trainer for the U.S. Men's and Women's volleyball teams in 1985 ... he rejoined the 49ers in May, 1986 as an assistant trainer ... during his five years with San Francisco, the 49ers won Super Bowl XIX (1985), Super Bowl XXIII (1989) and Super Bowl XXIV (1990) ... he received a bachelor of arts degree in physical education and a master of arts in physical education from the University of the Pacific ... Fred and his wife, Toni, have two children, Kelly and Matt.
